Communications: The committee has responsibility to insure that YLD programs and events are promoted via social media outlets, including Facebook and Twitter. This committee also insures that YLD information on the BABC website is current and that submissions for the BABC's publications, the City Bar Report and The Baltimore Barrister, are done in a timely manner.

Continuing Legal Education: The Continuing Legal Education Committee presents monthly seminars on legal issues of interest to the membership, with an emphasis on practice pointers and practical advice for less-experienced lawyers. The work of this Committee includes the Breakfast with the Bench lecture series and other lectures featuring members of the Bench and Bar.

Events: The Events Committee organizes social activities for the membership, which include the Annual Holiday Party, Wine Tasting, Bull Pen Parties and other social events sponsored by the YLD.

Public Education: The Public Education Committee provides outreach, programming and information designed to educate the public about the law, the legal system and the profession. The work of the Committee includes: Law Day activities, which often include a mock trial participated in by members of the Bench, Bar, and students from local schools; the Junior Judges program; legal seminars for parents and mentoring at local schools; hosting legal information booths at community gatherings including the Fells Point Festival; and providing grants to City students to sponsor educational projects and excursions.

Public Service: The Public Service Committee organizes the charitable work of the YLD, which includes, but is not limited to, the long running annual Holiday Party for Children Living in Homeless Shelters, and volunteering in the community through local organizations including Beans & Bread.

Membership: The Membership Committee dedicates its efforts to increasing awareness about membership and participation in the Bar Association of Baltimore City, and particularly its Young Lawyers' Division. Programs organized by the Membership Committee include happy hours, networking events, associate lunches, and law school programs.

Policy and Planning: The Policy and Planning Committee reviews and makes recommendations about the YLD Bylaws and other policy issues, and periodically updates the Long Range Plan.
