ADR Committee

The ADR Committee presented two CLE programs this year. On February 7, 2022, Jeff Trueman, Esq., presented an open conversation on about Advanced Mediation, *The Secret Sauce is not In a Cookbook*. The agenda of this presentation included: "moving beyond mediation frameworks (ethics regarding the practice standards and the reality of mediating litigated cases), setting the table (pre-session work), working the process (ethics regarding impartiality and omni-partiality), and managing difficult conversations and responding to angry participants." There was a question-and-answer period and each participant

was given a copy of the extensive power point presentation prepared by Mr. Trueman. On February 28, 2022, the ADR Committee presented a CLE, *Best Practices for Settlement Conferences*. The presenters in this CLE were the Honorable Edward J. Angeletti, the Honorable W. Michel Pierson, and the Honorable Martin P. Welch. The moderator of this program was Courtney Jackson-Mills, Esq., Director Civil ADR Program, Circuit Court for Baltimore City. There were questions and answers in this program. The Committee has monthly meetings and Ms. Jackson-Mills provides information on Civil ADR program in the Circuit Court.

Budget and Finance Committee

The Budget and Finance Committee was very active this year. I worked with our new Executive Director, Karen Fast, in reviewing the past procedures of the Bar Association and updating them. Ms. Fast was in regular contact with questions and proposals regarding how we

On May 23, 2022, the Bar Association of Baltimore City's Diversity Committee organized an in-depth training and educational program with FreeState Justice entitled *Name and Gender Marker Change Training – Representing Transgender and Gender Non-Conforming Clients Effectively*. This training included information regarding name change process in Maryland, administrative gender change options, court orders recognizing legal gender identity and much more. The

training was available to attorneys who committed to take one pro bono name/gender case with FreeState Justice within one year of registration. The training was conducted by Phillip Westry, Legal Director, FreeState Justice.

The Diversity Committee looks forward to continuing hosting educational trainings on topics of diversity, equity and inclusion and welcome feedback and suggestions from members of the association.

Estates & Trusts Committee

In its tenth year, the Committee has continued many of the initiatives from its prior years as well as several new initiatives despite the continuing pandemic. A critical initiative is to maintain the Committee's active, cooperative partnership with the Orphans' Court for Bal-

timore City and the Office of the Register of Wills for Baltimore City.

The Committee benefits from the active participation and valuable insight of those of the judges from Orphans' Court for Baltimore City and the Register of Wills or her staff, who attend the meetings. In furtherance of that initiative, the Committee held its tenth annual "State of the Orphans' Court and Register of Wills" address in November via Zoom. The address was delivered by the following Judges of the Or-

phans' Court for Baltimore City and the Register of Wills: Chief Judge Lewyn Scott Garrett, Associate Judge Michele Loewenthal, Associate Judge Charles G. Bernstein and the Register of Wills, Belinda K. Conaway. The address covered a wide range of issues relevant to the Baltimore City Orphans' Court and the Register of Wills. The address was followed by an open question and answer session. Those in attendance directed questions to the judges and the register.

Keeping our members apprised of legislative changes, changes to the Maryland Rules and developing proposed changes are important initiatives of the Committee. Several Committee members also serve on the MSBA Estate and Trust Law Section Council and led several discussions throughout the year regarding changes to the law affecting estates and trusts practice. The Committee's September meeting featured a discussion with Shakisha A. Morgan about the Uniform Partition of Heirs' Property Act. The Committee's February Meeting featured discussions with Committee member, Kelly Preteroti, about

the SAFE Act legislation and with Committee member, Mark Weisner, Assistant Attorney General, Courts and Judicial Affairs Divisions, about issues facing the Orphans' Courts. The Committee's May meeting featured Legislative and Rules updates by Christine W. Hubbard, the Chair Elect of the MSBA Estate and Trust Law Section.

Providing information to the public and attorneys by providing education and outreach programs is another important initiative of the Committee. Committee member, Timothy Chance, led the MVLS My Home, My Deed, My Legacy Project, assisting homeowners with basic estate planning and deed issues to aid in housing stability. Fisher, of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore County, presented Tips for Seeking Attorneys' Fees Before the Orphans' Courts, moderated by Committee Co-Chair, Jennifer S. Yeagle.

Ethics Committee

On May 31, 2022, the subcommittee of the Historical Committee held a Virtual Memorial Service for members of the Baltimore Bar who passed away in 2019 through 2020.

Judicial Selections Committee

Jason St. John, Esq., Saul Ewing Arnstein & Lehr, LLP

In 2021-2022, the Judicial Selections Committee interviewed approximately thirty-five applicants for vacancies on the District and Circuit Courts. The Committee conducted these interviews by Zoom with each applicant appearing for 20 minutes. At the conclusion of each interview session, the Committee deliberated and voted on its

ratings for each applicant. The Committee, thereafter, informed the Judicial Nominating Commission of its ratings with a brief synopsis about each applicant. The Committee also sent individual letters to each applicant in which we shared our rating and rationale for that applicant only.

Legislation Committee

Domonique Flowers, Esq., Social Security Administration

Our first meeting for the year took place through zoom on September 23, 2021. At this meeting, committee members introduced each other, discussed the purpose of the Legislation Committee, reviewed the Final Report of the Legislative Committee to the Maryland Judicial Council, talked about submitting publications for the Baltimore Barrister and discussed action items to prepare for the General Assembly Session in 2022. Our next meeting occurred on January 20, 2022, when we discussed potential bills that might be of interest to BABC. After selecting which bills we would act on, we then sent out inquires to individual committee sections for further input and comment. We sent an inquiry regarding HB0210 (Criminal Trials-Spousal Privilege-Exception) to the Criminal Law and Family Law Committees. We also sent an inquiry regarding HB0244 (Civil Actions-Damages-Use of Race, Ethnicity, and Gender Data) to the Workers' Compensation Committee. Near the end of January, we received a reply from the chair of the Workers' Compensation Committee who indicated that the bill would not impact any workers' compensation actions because benefits under the Act are set by statute and are not "damages" in the way that a jury award would be in a civil action. The chair of the committee concluded that it was reasonable for BABC to take a stand on a bill like this, but that her committee is not the logical one to do it. We also received a reply from the Family Law Committee indicating that they would look into HB0210 concerning the information we provided to them and would follow up with us.

In January and February 2022, the Legislation Committee continued to correspond with members to discuss the actions to take on certain bills as well as discuss the committee hearing schedule for these

bills. We eventually heard back from the Criminal Law Committee who provided a response concerning HB210 (Criminal Trials-Spousal Privilege-Exception). This bill which would provide that the spouse of a person on trial for a crime may be compelled to testify as an adverse witness if the spouse and the person on trial married after the date on which the alleged crime for which the person is on trial occurred. The committee chair voiced his opposition to any change to the current law indicating that this would affect the legal rights of a spouse who chooses not to testify, and the date of the marriage does not affect any legal perspective, as it is the opinion of the testifying spouse that would be a matter of concern.

We attempted to set up a meeting with Mr. Montgomery from the MSBA about having him speak to us concerning the process to track bills. However, we later learned that he was no longer employed with the MSBA. We were also planning to collaborate with the Solo Practitioner Committee to plan a landlord/tenant CLE that would discuss the new laws that had been enacted concerning renters in Maryland. However, members of the Legislation Committee decided not to go through with this initiative, and we did not hear back from the chair of the Solo Practitioner Committee. We tried to schedule another meeting of the Legislation Committee in December 2021 prior to the start of session in 2022 but we were unable to meet due to technical issues. Following our January 2022 meeting, we tried to elicit the responses of select committees to certain bills to determine what position we should take and whether we needed to testify at committee hearings. However, we were unable to receive commentary in time and provide recommendations to the BABC Executive Committee prior to the committee hearings scheduled for these bills.

Life & The Law Committee

The Life & the Law Committee was pleased to co-host a number of events for our members this bar year. Most notably, in April, the Committee co-hosted a New Lawyers Mental Health & Wellness Webinar with the Maryland State Bar Association and the Maryland Association for Justice. Alison Schurick, Co-Chair of the Life & the Law Committee, was a panelist at that webinar, which focused on helping

new/young lawyers develop proper and sustainable habits to promote work-life balance and prevent burnout. The Life & the Law Committee also hosted a webinar titled "Is the Thought of Retirement Planning Keeping You Awake at Night?" in which Jason L. Ditto, CFP, MBA, of TriBridge Partners Financial Planning & Investment, discussed the basics of financial planning and the importance of saving and risk management.

Membership Committee

The Committee, with the help of the Bar Office, provided several benefits for Sustaining Members including recognition in all BABC print and electronic publications, a special ribbon on name badges at all BABC functions, a highly coveted lapel pin, a printed version of The Baltimore Barrister, and two exclusive events. In the fall, the Sustaining Members were treated to a French wine and food pairing at Marie Louise Bistro. In the spring, their commitment to the Bar was honored with a five course German beer and food pairing at Guilford Hall Brewery. The Committee, with the assistance of the BABC President, drafted a written policy for handling late and unpaid dues. The proposal was presented to the Executive Council and approved unanimously. assisted with weeding out attorneys who were no longer practicing or living in Maryland.

The total membership dues collected by May 2022 were just shy of \$180,000. The year ended strong as the BABC collected more in dues than the previous year, all thanks to the hard work of the BABC staff.
