The work of this Committee includes the Breakfast with the Bench lecture series and other lectures featuring members of the Bench and Bar. Diversity & Inclusion: The Diversity and Inclusion Committee promotes and supports diversity in the legal profession and within the YLD with respect to race, gender, religion, national origin and sexual orientation. Events: The Events Committee organizes social activities for the membership, which include the Annual Holiday Party, Spring Reception, and other social events sponsored by the YLD. Life & The Law: The Life & The Law Committee organizes social activities for members with new families to promote work-life balance. Membership: The Membership Committee leads the outreach and recruitment to promote participation in the BABC, particularly the YLD. Programs organized by the Membership Committee include: networking events, law school programs, and happy hours. Mentorship: The Mentorship Committee matches young lawyers and/or law students with more experienced attorneys in the BABC and plans events for mentors/mentees to get together in a social setting. Public Education: The Public Education Committee provides outreach, programming and information designed to educate the public about the law, the legal system and the profession. The work of this Committee includes mentoring and presenting at local schools on legal issues, facilitating mock trials, and sponsoring educational projects and excursions. Public Relations: The Public Relations Committee promotes all YLD programs and events via social media, ensures the YLD information on the BABC website is updated, and provides submission to BABC publications, including The Baltimore Barrister, City Bar Report, and Weekly Bar Review. Public Service: The Public Service Committee organizes and promotes community service and charitable events for the YLD, including the Annual Holiday Party for Children Living in Shelters and

volunteering with local organizations.
