About the Service:

The Lawyer Referral and Information Service (LRIS) of the Bar Association of Baltimore City (BABC) is a service to members of the BABC, as well as a public service. LRIS was formed to assist the public in obtaining qualified legal counsel, to provide general legal information to the public, and to inform the public of other resources that may be able to provide assistance. The BABC's Lawyer Referral Service meets American Bar Association Standards for lawyer referral services.

Qualifications to Join LRIS Panel:

- 1. Any attorney who has been duly admitted to the Court of Appeals of Maryland and in good standing for a minimum of three years, and has paid their annual assessment to the Client Security Trust Fund of Maryland;
- 2. Has no pending criminal charges or convictions involving moral turpitude or violence;
- 3. Must maintain malpractice insurance of a minimum amount of \$1,000,000;
- 4. Must agree to arbitrate fee disputes arising from LRIS referrals through BABC's Fee Arbitration Committee, during and after their membership expires;
- 5. Must supply update information regarding referrals as requested; Non-compliance will result in suspension from LRIS panel rotation until such update is received;
- 6. Must abide by minimum qualification and mentor policies as set forth in the LRIS application packet.

After applying, what will happen next?

After applying, your application will be forwarded to a member of the LRIS Committee, who will conduct a 15 to 30 minute interview with you to review your experience and give final approval to

your application.

Membership Dues: Dues are paid on a calendar year. Payment is made out to: BABC LRIS **BABC Members:** \$225/Non-BABC Members: \$400

Fees: There is a \$35 cost to the client to receive a referral to you. This \$35 fee entitles the client to a 30-minute consultation with you. In addition, if you are retained, 15% of any fees you earn are due to the Bar Association of Baltimore City (please see Sections: VIII, IX, and X of the LRIS Rules for greater detail).

Panel Sign-Up Form

Please check the areas of law in which you wish to accept referrals. You <u>must</u> meet the qualifications listed below to sign-up for a panel and <u>each</u> sub-panel.

Panel Qualifications:

Each Panel Attorney must meet the experience requirements as specified in the Maryland Rules of Professional Conduct and must have handled a **minimum of two (2) cases to <u>conclusion</u>** for **each** Panel **and** Sub-panel from which he or she chooses to receive referrals. Panel members are not allowed to accept a case which they do not meet our qualifications to handle. If a member desires to be on a panel they are not qualified for, they may request a mentor* through our mentor program, and may be conditionally approved at the discretion of the committee member conducting the interview. Every attempt will be made to place a prospective member with a mentor, although placement can not be guaranteed.
