## Always Respect (and provide assistance to) Your Elders!

They are often referred to as seniors, senior citizens, the elderly or older adults. Regardless of what name you may use to refer to those who are aged 60 and older, we must always

remember that they are the bedrock of any community. And considering their importance, on Saturday, April 12, 2025, Senior Legal Services, a program of the Bar Association of Baltimore City and the Baltimore Bar Foundation, spent the day giving back to those upon whose shoulders we all stand. At this annual event, Senior Legal Services (SLS) presented, "Law Day for Seniors", where staff, volunteers and others in the City's legal community provided information and support catered to the needs and demands of older adults. Law Day for Seniors is a free event open to all of Baltimore City's older adults. It is a full-day of educational programs and workshops providing information on

consumer protection, housing, estates and trusts, tax sale prevention and the ever-popular Q&A sessions. Seniors get to peruse many vendor booths that provide information and takeaways geared specifically towards them. The event also includes breakfast and lunch for the approximately 200-300 seniors who usually attend.

In 1991, the Baltimore City Office of Aging wanted to expand services provided to seniors in Baltimore. Under the guidance and tutelage of then Executive Director, Kathy Sanzone, the BABC submitted a proposal and was awarded the contract. Founded in 1992, Senior Legal Services (the original name was "Legal Services to the Elderly") is a joint program of the BABC and Baltimore Bar Foundation, which was created to provide free legal advice, services and representation to Baltimore City residents aged sixty (60) and older. SLS's mission is to provide quality legal services to an underserved population at risk of losing resources and to empower them to age in place and thrive in their community. SLS provides vital pro bono legal services to low-income older adults on a broad range of civil legal matters including estate planning, consumer and debt collection issues, landlord/tenant disputes, housing matters, foreclosure prevention, probate, and guardianship. A typical day includes advising seniors, drafting critical legal documents, representing clients in court, and conducting outreach presentations. SLS conducts client intake and consultations via telephone and in person at their office located in the Cummings Courthouse. SLS also meets with clients at Baltimore senior centers, senior apartment buildings, and in some cases, at clients' homes when travel is not possible due to disabilities.

The first Senior Law Day was held on May 9, 1992, at Courthouse East. Keynote speakers at the inaugural event included Kurt L. Schmoke, Mayor of Baltimore, J. Joseph Curran Jr., Attorney General of Maryland, and Stuart O. Simms, State's Attorney for Baltimore City. As the event grew, it moved to the Wabash District Courthouse in 2000, to New Psalmist Baptist Church in 2018, and now is hosted at the Middle Branch Fitness & Wellness Center in partnership with the Baltimore City Department of Recreation & Parks, Senior Division.

As a small but dedicated team,  $\operatorname{SLS}$ 

relies heavily on support from the legal community. Attorneys and law firms can assist by:

- Sponsoring the annual Cabaret & Cabernet fundraiser
- Volunteering to accept pro bono cases referred by SLS
- Serving on SLS committees
- Participating in outreach efforts, including Law Day for Seniors

Robust volunteer and financial support are critical to meeting the increasing need for services. SLS is supported by:

- Grant funding from entities such as Maryland Legal Services Corp. and the Baltimore City Department of Health
- Donations from individuals, community organizations and corporate sponsors such as Exelon Corporation

Continued support is critical to ensure that Baltimore's seniors have access to the legal services they need to maintain their independence and security. # Spring has Sprung!

The birds are singing, flowers are blooming, pollen is everywhere. This means two things:

plants for me to kill off... I mean try to keep alive.

Despite my best efforts, I have a brown thumb. This is one step above a black thumb, and I achieved that status by managing to keep a low maintenance plant alive during Covid. Sadly, said plant did not survive when we moved last year.

So, if you're like me and you love plants, but they don't seem to love you back, I have some good news. One of the easiest plants to keep alive are succulents, and the YLD would like to provide you with an opportunity to enjoy some of these low maintenance little buddies. Willow, and we're so excited, we "wet our plants" or should I say, "we know this experience will be unbe-leaf-able". Space is limited, so secure your spot fast!

If you're unable to join us, but still would like to 'spruce' up your office with a new 'frond,' here are a couple of office friendly plants you may want to check out:

The Snake Plant (Sansevieria) is perfect for low-light environments and is incredibly low-maintenance. They require minimal watering, making them ideal for busy office settings. Not only do they purify the air by absorbing toxins, but their tall, upright leaves add a touch of elegance to your desk or office corner.

The Spider Plant (Chlorophytum Comosum) is known for its air-purifying properties, and is another easy-to-carefor option. It thrives in indirect light and is adaptable to a range of conditions. Spider plants also produce small "pups" or offshoots that can be propagated, so you can give one to your (office buddy!) (co-counsel?)

Pothos (Epipremnum Aureum) is one of the most resilient houseplants, making

it ideal for offices. Its trailing vines can be hung in baskets or placed on shelves, creating a lush green space. Pothos does well in low light and can survive with minimal attention, requiring only occasional watering.

And finally, the plant that has my name written all over it, the ZZ Plant (Zamioculcas Zamiifolia). Perfect for offices with low natural light, it's drought-tolerant and can go weeks without water, making it an excellent choice for those who often forget to tend to their plants. Its glossy, dark green leaves also bring some color against those builder's beige walls.



The Baltimore Bar Foundation is a charitable organization, incorporated in 1970 to foster and maintain the honor and integrity of the profession of the law; to improve and to facilitate the administration of justice, to enhance and improve the image of lawyers, and to promote the study of the law and research therein and the diffusion of knowledge thereof.

In furtherance of those objectives, the Foundation provides financial support for non-profit programs and organizations that have a significant relation to the Baltimore City community and that may be expected to contribute to:

- 1. the improvement of the administration of justice
- 2. the provision of legal services through staff attorneys or unpaid volunteers to persons who find it difficult to obtain legal services through normal channels
- 3.the education of the general public, including primary and secondary school students, regarding law and the legal system
- 4.the improvement of the image of lawyers and of the legal profession through lawyer participation in community outreach programs and other good works

Although on occasion the Foundation will provide all of the funding necessary for the accomplishment of a given objective, in most cases only a portion of the projected budget will be underwritten, usually on the express condition that the balance of the funds be raised from other sources. Grants of "seed money" in this manner for a law-related project often provide help and confidence for foundations that wish to offer gifts for such projects but lack expertise in the legal field to make a judgement as to whether the project is worthy of support. Thus, the Foundation can act as a catalyst in bringing support from other donors to projects that require more funds than the
